According to reports both directly from Psalm 100 and from *The Daily Tar Heel*, Psalm 100's removal of student _____ was motivated not by his sexual orientation—that is, his status as a gay person—but rather because of the fact that he no longer agreed with Psalm 100's interpretation of the Bible. Indeed, Psalm 100 reported to FIRE that the decision to remove _____ was an extremely painful one for the group, and was marked by protracted discussions within the group and with _____ himself.
