Indeed, Psalm 100 reported to FIRE that the decision to remove was an extremely painful one for the group, and was marked by protracted discussions within the group and with himself.

An indication that Psalm 100 based its decision solely on religious beliefs rather than his status comes from the group's report that two votes were actually taken in light of changing understanding of the Bible.
