no reasonable provisions for the effective and proper conduct of such activities.

Such rules and regulations shall not prohibit the right of students to exercise free expression, including no limitation on the use of electronic media or other means of printed or electronic communication and the wearing of clothing or other accessories on campus, which so-called "free speech zones" or "free speech areas" are not intended to be a restriction on the free expression of students or faculty. Such rules and regulations shall not be intended to restrict the right of students to exercise free expression or the right of faculty to exercise free expression or the right of students to exercise free expression or the right of faculty to exercise free expression.

Of course section 2(c) cannot be construed to prohibit speech protected by the First Amendment. See *Khademi v. South Orange County Community College Dist.*, 2011 CD C 00000000.

Moreover, section 2(b) is so construed consistent with Article 9, section 2 of the California Constitution, which provides even greater protections for speech than the First Amendment. See *San Leandro Teachers Ass'n v. Governing Bd. of San Leandro Unified School Dist.*, 2011 CD C 00000000.

Under Article 9, section 2, the college may restrict speech or assembly only if the manner of expression is so-called "purely political" and the restriction is necessary to protect the college's interest in the proper and efficient operation of the college. See *U.C. Nuclear Weapons Labs Conversion Project v. Lawrence Livermore Laboratory*, 2011 CD C 00000000. The college does not prohibit speech by the students of decrying the campus as a non-political forum.

Policy No. 1 is therefore not in violation of the First Amendment by the enforcement of the non-political forum. As previously stated, the college's non-political forum is not a "purely political" forum, and the college's restriction on the non-political forum is not a restriction on the free expression or assembly of the students of the college.
